Programs & Services for People with Brain Injuries

What is the Headway Centre Program and who does it serve?

Headway Centres are community based programs for people with acquired brain injuries. Members run their centre through participation in work departments and may also access the centre's many drop-in leisure and scheduled activities.

How to become a member.

Headway members must meet these criteria:

- Members must have experienced a brain injury and be between the ages of 19 and 64.
- Members must be able to get to and from the Headway Centre independently or with the support of a care provider.
- Members requiring any personal assistance must be accompanied by their own attendant.
- Members without attendants must be able to manage their own medications and self-care needs.
- Members must not act disruptively or pose a health or safety risk to other members and staff.

Individual membership is \$12 annually and is pro-rated from April to April at \$1/per month. Financial assistance may be available.

Members may choose to receive newsletters and email distributions.

Headway Departments

Headway departments assist members in gaining valuable skills and experience to help them further their personal and vocational goals. Members collaborate with staff to carry out the operation and maintenance of the centre through voluntary participation in various departments.

When do departments operate?

The departments operate Monday to Friday during Centre hours and are closed for all statutory holidays.

Members participate in running the centre by volunteering in any of these work departments:

- Maintenance Department
- Communications Department
- Membership Department
- Planning Department
- Prevention Outreach Department
- Kitchen Department
